Educational Courses offered by ASA PP Committee

Are you a “Qualified Appraiser?”

Appraisals for charitable donations and estates must be made by “qualified appraisers,” states the IRS. Do you qualify?

The IRS emphasizes the need for education about the properties that you appraise. Do you need to supplement or expand your knowledge?

The Internal Revenue Service has defined “Qualified Appraiser” as an individual who (1) has earned an appraisal designation from a recognized professional appraiser organization or has otherwise met minimum education and experience requirements set forth in regulations prescribed by the Secretary, (2) regularly performs appraisals for which the individual receives compensation, and (3) meets such other requirements as may be prescribed by the Secretary in regulations or other guidance. Section 170(f)(11)(E)(ii)

Look through these courses and see which ones will move you along the road to being a “qualified appraiser.”

Time to Reaccredit?

To remain an accredited appraiser and maintain your designation by ASA, members must submit evidence of professional growth through continuing education. ASA requires 100 hours every five years.

Review the offerings to meet your reaccreditation hours and at the same time, expand your knowledge and your competence with property and valuation theory.

Are you current with your USPAP credentials?

The 7 and 15 hour courses that are offered here specifically focus on users of Standards 7 and 8, the standards that are for personal property appraisers.

The 15 hour course was developed by the Appraisal Foundation. All courses are all taught by AQB-certified instructors.

When did you last take the Principles of Valuation courses?

Remember that appraisal is a developing profession. Terms, regulations, laws and standards all change. Are you changing with them? Are your appraisals current with recent terminology?

There are many courses in many subjects as well as numerous offerings of Principles of Valuation courses.
