The American Society of Appraisers Ad Valorem/Mass Appraisal is a new specialty designation that offers two tracks: Ad Valorem/Mass Appraisal—General and Ad Valorem/Mass Appraisal—Residential.

- **Who is eligible to participate?**

The program is designed for assessors and private practice mass appraisers.
